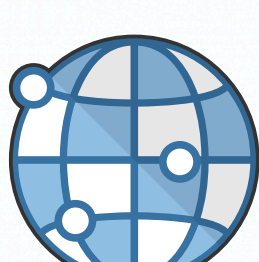

IT IS ENTIRELY NEW

The course is two years old. AGIC was launched in 2018, and is the result of a cooperative effort by an unusually high number of Departments (Cultures, Politics and Society; Economics and Statistics "Cognetti de Martiis"; Law; Foreign Languages, Literatures and Modern Cultures; Historical Studies; Humanities) of the University of Turin, Italy.

IT PROPOSES A NOVEL APPROACH

The AGIC program in international cooperation combines the approach of international studies and globalization studies with the in-depth, multidisciplinary perspective of area studies – that is, multidisciplinary social research focusing on specific geographic or culturally defined regions.

IT BRINGS YOU TO THE RESEARCH FRONTIER

AGIC is entirely taught in English. It therefore brings students to the frontier of research and fieldwork in international cooperation, with an emphasis on latest developments and special concern for the historical evolution of development theories.

ITS TEACHERS ARE REAL SPECIALISTS

AGIC makes a difference: teachers of specific "area" studies subjects are real specialists and experienced practitioners conducting their research at the University of Turin, and other leading scholars from all over the world (visiting professors).

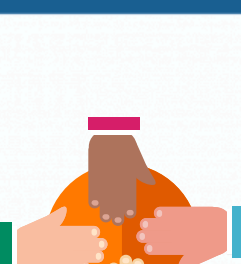

IT FACILITATES INTERNSHIPS AND STAGES ABROAD

AGIC students are strongly encouraged to profit from internships and stages abroad, and among them Uni.coo development cooperation projects in Africa, Asia and Latin America, Erasmus+ opportunities of outgoing mobility in non-European countries (Libano, Marocco, Russia, Uganda), and the "Región Latinoamericana" scholarship to attend a curriculum on Latin American politics and culture in Buenos Aires.

IT IS HELD AT THE CAMPUS LUIGI EINAUDI

The new, high-tech, American-style Campus Luigi Einaudi provides the ideal framework for interdisciplinary approaches to complex issues like growth and development, of the kind of those usually associated with area studies. The Campus Library has 650 thousand volumes, and about 800 seats for readers and research.
