

## Curriculum Vitae: Paola Minoia

### Short summary

Paola Minoia works as an Associate Professor in Political and Economic Geography at the Department of Cultures, Politics and Society of the University of Turin. She has been awarded the National Scientific Habilitation for Full Professorship in Italian Universities (ASN) and in Finnish Universities (*dosentti*). In Finland, where she served as a Senior Lecturer from 2008-2022, she is currently an Adjunct Professor at the Faculty of Social Sciences, Global Development Studies Unit, University of Helsinki, also affiliated to the HY interfaculty research programme Helsinki Centre on Sustainability Studies (HELSUS) and the research programme in Social Inequalities (InEQ) of the same university.

She has over 25 years of teaching experience and a long record of BA and MA supervision. At the PhD level, she is a member of four doctoral scientific committees: in Historical, Geographical and Anthropological Studies (University of Padua and Venice), in Peace Studies (La Sapienza, Roma), in Political, Societal and Regional Changes (University of Helsinki) and Interdisciplinary Environmental Sciences (University of Helsinki). She has supervised four candidates, and is currently supervising six more, in Italy and Finland. She has also served as an opponent in final doctoral defences and as a member of doctoral examination panels.

She has worked on postdevelopment and political ecology and has published on themes related to water and environmental rights, epistemic justice and cultural rights of Indigenous people, minorities and refugees, tourism gentrification and right to the city. She has done research in various countries of Sub-Saharan Africa, Northern Africa, Middle East, Latin America, and Italy.

She has been a PI in various research projects. Currently, she is leading a PRIN/PNRR 2022 project named "*Post-development geographies of Local Food Systems: Community-based networks addressing food insecurity*" and leads the Working group "Research" of the COST Action 19129 "*Decolonising development*". She also serves in the editorial boards of the scientific journals "*Globalizations*", "*Fennia-International Journal of Geography*", and "*ACME-An International Journal for Critical Geographies*".

3) **CA19129 - Decolonising Development: Research, Teaching and Practice**: MC member of the EU/Cost Action (2020-2024) and Leader of WG1 Decolonizing Development Research. The Action DecolDEV takes on the challenge to reconstruct the concept and practice of development after its deconstruction. It aims for a resetting and diversification of the actors, structures, institutions and spaces in which knowledge about and for development is produced, shared, contested and put into practice. The Action will progress beyond the state-of-the-art through exploring and formulating alternatives in three areas: Research, Teaching and Practice.

4) **Tourism gentrification and peer-to-peer platforms**: small grants from the Faculty of Social Sciences, University of Helsinki (2019-2020). During the past decade, Internet-based peer-to-peer platforms have enabled a new generation of entrepreneurs in tourism and mobility. Services that were traditionally in the hands of specialized and certified companies are integrated with, and partly substituted by, (theoretically) non-professional offers. This diffused supply was initially called sharing economy, but it is growing into a new form of capitalist speculation. Sometimes seen as a driver for revitalizing neighborhoods, sometimes as a gentrifier or a disruptive business model, it affects both residents and operators.

5) **Political ecology of water in the Taita Hills, Kenya**. Coordinator of the Socio-ecological research sub-team of the Academy-funded project TAITAWATER (PI: Petri Pellikka, 2012-2016). The study has involved a multi-method participatory approach to study critically, spatially and historically, the drivers of environmental deterioration and water scarcity in the Taita Hills. The research has looked at the socio-environmental and political dimensions of the water crisis, which relate to problems of disempowerment of local farmers deriving from colonial and post-colonial structures, cultural changes and also bureaucratic framing of the issues that challenge their very participation in problem solving and resource co-management.

6) **Local knowledge and power in irrigation practices in Tafilalet, Morocco**. Erasmus plus Helsinki-Meknès-Errachidia (2016-2018). Project in collaboration with the University of Meknès-Errachidia and the NGO AOFEP from Ferkla oasis.
