

Curriculum Vitae: Paola Minoia

Short summary

Paola Minoia works as an Associate Professor in Political and Economic Geography at the University of Turin since 2019 and holds the Italian National Scientific Qualification as Full Professor since 2013. She is also a Senior lecturer at the Faculty of Social Sciences, Global Development Studies Unit, University of Helsinki, since 2008; as a Dosentti (Adjunct Professor) at the University of Helsinki, Faculty of Science, Geography Unit, since 2014. Since 2017 she is also affiliated to the new HY interfaculty research programme Helsinki Centre on Sustainability Studies (HELSUS) and the research programme in Social Inequalities (InEQ).

Her research deals with (post)development, postcoloniality, decoloniality, critical geography, political ecology, participatory research and qualitative methods. Themes: international aid, environment politics, water and natural resource management, local/indigenous knowledges, local evaluation of environment and climate change, environmental justice, civil society dis/empowerment, environmental migration, and tourism gentrification. Studied areas: Africa and the Middle East, Ecuador and Italy.

2) **CA19129 - Decolonising Development: Research, Teaching and Practice**: MC member of the EU/Cost Action (2020-2024). The Action DecolDEV takes on the challenge to reconstruct the concept and practice of development after its deconstruction. It aims for a resetting and diversification of the actors, structures, institutions and spaces in which knowledge about and for development is produced, shared, contested and put into practice. The Action will progress beyond the state-of-the-art through exploring and formulating alternatives in three areas: Research, Teaching and Practice.

3) **Tourism gentrification and peer-to-peer platforms**: small grants from the Faculty of Social Sciences, University of Helsinki (2019-2020). During the past decade, Internet-based peer-to-peer platforms have enabled a new generation of entrepreneurs in tourism and mobility. Services that were traditionally in the hands of specialized and certified companies are integrated with, and partly substituted by, (theoretically) non-professional offers. This diffused supply was initially called sharing economy, but it is growing into a

new form of capitalist speculation. Sometimes seen as a driver for revitalizing neighborhoods, sometimes as a gentrifier or a disruptive business model, it affects both residents and operators.

4) **Political ecology of water in the Taita Hills, Kenya.** Coordinator of the Socio-ecological research sub-team of the Academy-funded project TAITAWATER (PI: Petri Pellikka, 2012-2016). The study has involved a multi-method participatory approach to study critically, spatially and historically, the drivers of environmental deterioration and water scarcity in the Taita Hills. The research has looked at the socio-environmental and political dimensions of the water crisis, which relate to problems of disempowerment of local farmers deriving from colonial and post-colonial structures, cultural changes and also bureaucratic framing of the issues that challenge their very participation in problem solving and resource co-management.

5) **Local knowledge and power in irrigation practices in Tafilalet, Morocco.** Erasmus plus Helsinki-Meknès-Errachidia (2016-2018). Project in collaboration with the University of Meknès-Errachidia and the NGO AOFEP from Ferkla oasis.
